Note from the Pastor



As in almost everything in life, if you do the basics well, the rest will take care of itself. Know your primary colors well and your palette can produce marvelous pastels. Build a solid foundation and the edifice is limited only by your imagination. Know and do the basics of your faith well and your life lived will be well lived. As any good coach would tell you, it's all in the fundamentals, the basics, the simple things you do over and over that become second nature on which you build your game of life. And so from time to time we need to be called back to the basics, the fundamentals, the foundations.

The foundation of our faith in God is Jesus Christ crucified and risen from the dead. The enmity that we once believed was between God and ourselves no longer exists (if it ever existed in the first place). Jesus has shown us that we are intimately tied to God, that He is the very ground of our being and that He is love. That's basic stuff.

The foundations of the Holy Divine Liturgy, the Mass we celebrate every Sunday is both a recalling of and making real this incredible mystery of Emmanuel, God with us, in the flesh. Every Sunday through song and word and ritual action we make real the drama of our lives in Christ Jesus as His sacred Body. And if this is the basic stuff we do, then let's do it well. Let's do it right.

Every two years we take one Sunday out as a parish to ask ourselves how well we are worshiping. Are we prepared? Do we know what we are doing? Are we doing it well? Next Sunday we will have our bi-annual Etiquette Sunday. It is the day when we ask ourselves how we can best preserve and if need be, shore up the very foundations of our faith.

Whenever I Baptize a child at Liturgy and they begin to cry, I remind them and all of us that life is not easy. At times it hurts. And life is always messy. For years I had a sign on my door that read, "Bless this Mess." While human messiness will always be with us, when it comes to the things that really count, there is no excuse for sloppiness. Sloppiness means you just don't care, you are only going through the motions, and nothing is really happening. And there is no excuse for

sloppiness in the Sacred Liturgy.

On the day the Stanley Cup visited the friendly confines of Mary Queen, people lined up around the block to see this secular chalice of hockey's salvation. And they arrived early! They were here more than one half hour before the cup arrived. With reverence they patiently waited in line to see it, and (hopefully) touch it, kiss it. (But alas, it is too sacred to be touched.) As I watched this drama unfold I couldn't help but think, "What's wrong with this picture?" People we see at the church maybe at Christmas and Easter were jockeying for position to bow before one of the gods of Baal. Now, don't get me wrong. Hockey is fine and fun (although I am not quite sure what it does to the family life of traveling teams) but it is not God. We smirk at those who bowed down before the golden calf and yet we...

Now, the great irony of this situation is that every Sunday morning we make present not just a silver chalice, but the Cup of the new and everlasting Covenant. Every Sunday morning the miracle of transformation and transfiguration takes place before our very eyes. And every Sunday we are invited not just to adore it but to participate in it, take it in, eat of it, drink it, and become a new people. And when do we arrive for this great event and celebration? Well, the bus unloads about 10:29 1/2. During the opening hymn you can still shoot a canon ball through the congregation and hit no one. By the responsorial psalm the church is starting to fill and maybe, maybe with a little luck by the time the Gospel is preached the congregation is present. Now I know, especially those of you with very young kids, getting to church on a Sunday morning on time is no mean task. It takes a great deal of work. And I have nothing but admiration for those of you who make this incredible effort Sunday after Sunday. But those of us who are just in the habit of being late Sunday after Sunday well... forgive me, but that's just plain sloppy. We can do better. We are better.

So be forewarned, next Sunday is our etiquette Sunday. We will look at what we do very well (no one is more welcoming than the community of Mary Queen) and we will look at what we do not do so well: showing up on time, leaving before Mass is over, talking to each other during Mass, putting your gum under the pew... ugh.

WANTED: EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS

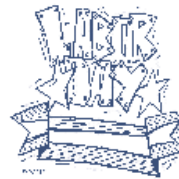

LITTLE ROCK SCRIPTURE STUDY Gospel of Mark Part II

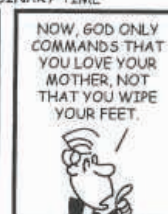
Our Adult Ed and Spirituality Ministry will offer the second half of the study of the Gospel of Mark with the Little Rock Scripture Study. If you did not participate in the first half we welcome you to come to share this time. The cost of the books is \$14.00. If you did participate last spring, you already have all the books you need. We will continue our study of Mark beginning the week of September 24, 2012 and finish up the week of November 12, 2012, just as the liturgical cycle of Mark comes to an end.

The meetings will be one hour, except for the first one which will be 90 minutes, and includes viewing a video every other week. We will again offer a daytime meeting on Tuesdays at 9:00 a.m. and 2 evening meetings on Tuesday and Wednesday starting at 7:30 p.m.

Last spring we learned that the actual author of Mark is unknown as is the intended audience. We also learned that Mark uses patterns of 3 or triads. We saw how Mark always uses the middle of these triads to shed light on the other two. This year we will see how the Transfiguration overshadows the cross in Mark's Gospel and how Jesus embraces the cross as a means to Transfiguration. We look forward to seeing you.

Mary Queen of Heaven 5K Run/Walk

Join us for the Inaugural Mary Queen of Heaven 5K Run/Walk, hosted by the MQH Men's Group, as we run and walk to promote fellowship, health and fitness in our faith community while providing support for missions and charities of the parish.

Entry Fee:

\$25 per adult (over 18) individual, \$15 per student (12 to 18), and \$65 per family (members of immediate family only, please). Children under 12 run free with a paid individual or family entry. Paid entry fee includes a bib number, race shirt, post-race snack and other goodies. Kids under 12 will receive a bib number and post-race snack, as well as can purchase a race shirt for \$10 online. Registration on race day will be \$30 per individual and \$80 per family, so please register early online! Registrations prior to October 10th will be guaranteed a shirt. Entries after October 10th will receive shirts as available. Walkers and runners only, no pets. Strollers welcome. No bikes, scooters or skateboards.

Race Course:

The race will begin in the MQH parking lot entrance and will feature a route through the beautiful tree-lined neighborhood surrounding the church. *Course map and details to follow.*
