Note from the Pastor



PRIESTHOOD SUNDAY

A few weeks ago when we celebrated the opening Mass for the anniversary of the Second Vatican Council with our Latin/English Mass I was drawn back to my own beginnings. As I incensed the altar and smelled the smells of my childhood I was in second grade again at St. Michael Church in Wheaton (nothing brings back memories like the sweet odors of our youth). For me it was pure magic.

I didn't come to being an altar boy until later in life because I was a "public" and that honor went to the boys of St. Michael School. I started serving in my junior year of high school and spent hours memorizing the Latin responses to the prayers at the foot of the altar. There I found myself attracted, lured by the God who called me. From a very young age I was aware of the presence of God and fell in love with the Lord.

I was reminded of that two weeks ago when I watched and listened to Kathleen Gusloff teach our Confirmandi about their holy work in preparation for Confirmation. She told the kids that when she was a teenager she was crazy, wildly, madly in love with Jesus. All I could do was smile to myself and relate. At that age I too was in love with the Lord. What do you do with love? Somehow it has to be manifested.

One of the great gifts of Vatican II was the universal call to holiness. With the implementation of the RCIA (Right of Christian Initiation for Adults), the Sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation were reinstated as the crown jewels of the Church. What that simply means is that by our Baptism, each of us are called to put on Christ, live a holy life and proclaim the Good News of Jesus by that life. Prior to the Council, it wasn't quite like that.

In the early 50's and 60's if you loved Jesus and wanted to served Him you went off to the convent, joined a religious order or became a priest. Obviously a lot of young people really loved Jesus and wanted to serve Him because the convents, religious order houses and diocesan seminaries were packed to the gills. When I entered Conception Seminary in 1962

there were over 500 seminarians, 54 in my college freshman class alone. In those days it was nothing to ordain nine or ten young men to the priesthood every spring. Today we are considered graced and lucky if we ordain two or three. What happened? What happened to the priesthood? Where did it go?

It went into you! One of the Council's great gifts in re-emphasizing the power of dignity of Baptism was to come to the realization that all Baptized Catholics shared in the priesthood of Jesus Christ. It was not just the ordained who were called to serve in the mission of the Church but *all* are called to service. They called it the "priesthood of the laity." The job of the priest is to manifest and mediate the incredible love of Christ in the world. That priesthood was no longer limited to those who were sacramentally ordained. That priesthood was to be shared by all Catholic Christians. And shared it has been. I have watched the laity exercise their priesthood in so many extraordinary and wonderful ways these past 50 years. And today I want to honor that priesthood, affirm it and call it to grow.

In my priesthood I have watched you exercise your priesthood in visiting the sick and shut-in, in bringing them Communion, in going to the hospitals, in working in programs for the poor like PADS and soup kitchens. You have worked in transitional housing and most importantly you have taught. I am always humbled, amazed and gratified when I walk into the classroom of our Religious Education teachers. A few weeks ago as I was passing out and blessing Bibles for our sixth graders, I couldn't help but be impressed at how well they were being prepared to receive the Word of God by their teachers, the lay priests in their classrooms.

Does this mean that the ordained priesthood is obsolete? I certainly hope not. I need the work. I've got children and grandchildren to support (jk, jk, just kidding). No, we will forever need those who are set aside and ordained to clarify on behalf of the community what the priesthood of Christ looks like. And there are some very special moments in our lives when we *need* an ordained priest. One of my favorite sayings is that you never need a priest until you need one. And when you *need* one, no one else will do. I know this and have experienced it in the very depth of

my being. The Church will always need ordained clergy and we are to continue to pray that the Lord send those workers into Christ's vineyard on behalf of His people. But that in no way diminishes your priesthood.

Today is priesthood Sunday. We indeed are to honor and to call forth the ordained priests of our Church. But I also want to call forth your priesthood and bring to consciousness God's vocation, His call to you to exercise your priesthood.

Every family is a little church, a domestic church. And you are the priests of that church. You are called to bless and to teach and to exemplify what it means to be a child of God. Exercise that priesthood well this Priesthood Sunday.

Listen to St. Peter as he exhorts all of us as priests in who we are to be and in what we are to do.

I have a special concern for you church leaders. I know what it's like to be a leader, in on Christ's sufferings as well as the coming glory. Here's my concern: that you care for God's flock with all the diligence of a shepherd. Not because you have to, but because you want to please God. Not calculating what you can get out of it, but acting spontaneously. Not bossily telling others what to do, but tenderly showing them the way.

When God, who is the best shepherd of all, comes out in the open with his rule, he'll see that you've done it right and commend you lavishly. And you who are younger must follow your leaders. But all of you, leaders and followers alike, are to be down to earth with each other, for -

*"God has had it with the proud,
But takes delight in just plain people."*

So be content with who you are, and don't put on airs. God's strong hand is on you; he'll promote you at the right time. Live carefree before God; he is most careful with you.

Keep a cool head. Stay alert. The Devil is poised to pounce, and would like nothing better than to catch you napping. Keep your guard up. You're not the only ones plunged into these hard times. It's the same with Christians all over the world. So keep a firm grip on the faith. The suffering won't last forever. It won't be long before this generous God who has great plans for us in Christ - eternal and glorious plans they are! - will have you put together and on your feet for good. He gets the last word; yes, he does.
