Note from the Pastor



Leaning Into the Pain

Yesterday was Groundhog Day. In the movie version, Bill Murray kept on repeating the same day over and over again until he finally got it right. So many of us continue to live our own Groundhog Day carrying the same pain with us, the same hurt with us day after day. And so we shall... until we get it right.

I learned a wonderful lesson as a young priest one night as I was counseling high school seminarian John Ramirez. In the midst of a session, John got a terrible Charlie Horse in his leg. I knew it was an excruciating pain as I asked him what was going on. "I've got a Charlie Horse, Father." "Well then why aren't you dancing around? Why aren't you trying to loosen it up? Why are you just sitting there?" "Because I learned that if I dance around, sometimes it just gets worse. If I react to it, it doesn't go away. But if I sit still long enough and feel the pain all the way through, it begins to disappear." He said this as tears of pain were running down his cheeks. In a short while it was over. I learned of something wonderful that night.

I learned that most of our chronic pain and hurt comes from our refusal to accept things as they are. It is this resistance that causes most of our unhappiness and pain. I have been hurt and this should not be. And so in my mind I play the hurt over and over again as I fight that feeling only to have it get worse. And then it repeats again tomorrow. Groundhog Day. There is something about spiritual and emotional pain. Once it gets inside it wants to continue to be fed. It is called the "pain body" and will rear its ugly head whenever it isn't paid attention to. The trouble is, when we fight it, it only gets worse. Is there another way to pay attention to it? There absolutely is. Like the young seminarian, we can lean into it, listen to it and even welcome it.

Welcome it? Are you crazy? Why would we welcome pain? We welcome it because until we do it does not go away. When we fight it, question it, rationalize or blame it, we only feed it and it gets worse. Welcoming it is the ability to feel it all the way through until it begins to disappear. And then we can let it go.

Franciscan Fr. Richard Rohr has what he calls the "Welcoming Prayer". It encourages us to identify in our life, now or in the past, a hurt or an offense by someone who has let you down or done you wrong. Here is the process for the Welcoming Prayer.

First. Feel the pain of the offense the way you first felt it, or are feeling it at this moment, and feel the hurt *in your body*. This is important because if we move the pain to our head and our mind we will go back to dualistic thinking and judgments: good guy/bad guy, win/lose, either/or.

Second. Feel the pain, the grief, the anger all the way through but do not create in your mind the usual win/lose scenario. Feel the pain and identify yourself with the suffering side of life. Feel how much it hurts to hurt. Feel how abandoned you felt if you were abandoned. Hold this in your "heart space", your body space. Do not process it mentally or even create some kind of story line. She did this, he did that and therefore I... Don't go there.

Now once you can move to that place and know how much it hurts to hurt, you will not want anybody else to experience that. You will not want to hurt back.

This might take some time. Welcome the experience and it can move you to Great Compassion. Don't fight it! Don't split, don't blame. Welcome the grief and anger and all its heaviness. Now it becomes the great teacher.

Once you feel it all the way through, you can begin to let it go. Paradoxically, in actually welcoming the pain and letting go of all your oppositional energy against the suffering, you will actually free yourself from it. Who would have thunk?


Basically, this is what Jesus did on the cross. He bore the pain. He didn't strike back, He didn't blame, He took on suffering. Then... and then He did the most remarkable thing in the world. He forgave. This is true Divine power. But it is a power that we have access to as well. To err is human, to forgive is divine.
